## **THE MANY USES OF DRY ICE**

(Please Read Safety Instructions Prior to Using)

1. Emergency and limited applications as a sole refrigerant.
2. Pack your ice cream in dry ice.
3. Ship frozen items with dry ice to insure frozen food will remain frozen.
4. When dry ice is used for freezing, place on top of items you want frozen.
5. When dry ice is used for cooling, place in bottom of cooler with cardboard between dry ice and products.
6. Keep dry ice wrapped in paper bag for safety and the insulation will extend the life of the dry ice.
7. Pack your trophy game animal or fish in dry ice to insure non-spoilage.
8. Keep your beer keg cold by placing pieces of dry ice mixed with wet ice around keg.
9. Create fog with dry ice. Fill a metal or plastic bowl  $\frac{3}{4}$  full of hot water -- add chunks of dry ice.
10. Root Beer Recipe:

1 Bottle Root Beer Extract (4 oz.)  
5 lbs. Sugar  
5 Gallons of Water  
10 to 15 lbs. of Dry Ice

11. Cider Recipe:

2 Gallons of Cider  
2 Bottles Vernors  
10 to 15 lbs. of Dry Ice

12. Shrink fitting bushings or other metal items.
13. Remove dents caused by mild hail damage.
14. Leak detection.
15. Purging flammable vapors from pipelines and storage vessels prior to repair.
16. Rapid cooling of molds, lathes and machine tooling.
17. Firming adhesives (helps to remove tile floors).
18. Low temperature testing.
19. Water well rehabilitation.
20. Attracting mosquitos away from desired areas.

Note: If you must pick-up dry ice the day before you are going to use it, store it in a small insulated cooler. **DO NOT STORE IN YOUR DEEP FREEZER.** Dry ice is (-109.25 F) below zero.

Always Handle Dry Ice with Care. If Dry Ice is removed from bag, wear gloves always. If Dry Ice meets bare skin, injury like a burn with result. If frostbite occurs seek medical treatment.
